

The VTS O and G job is very different to other schemes - and I think better for it.

Instead of the usual service provision you are essentially supernumerary, with no on call commitment, so the timetable is designed to give YOU the most exposure to areas relevant to general practice. e.g. antenatal clinic, gynae clinic, acute referrals. In addition to this there are fortnightly sessions at 3 GP practices in the area where you will see gynae patients in the primary care setting and a weekly GU clinic. There is also the opportunity to attend both peripheral clinics and specialist clinics in Oxford.

You are encouraged to use your time to obtain the DRCOG (and most people do) and will be supported to do this.

Overall the job provides useful Primary Care focussed training.
